Prior to reading, students read a list of statements about a given topic and begin to make connections with a text

they will soon read. Activating Prior Knowledge & Anticipation Guide - Reading Anticipation Guide + Character POV To help students understand point of view (POV), you can use an anticipation guide where students write down how they feel about the statements. Then, after they read the story, they write down how a specific character feels about the same statements.
